New Graduation Requirements for 2014

Beginning next fall, current freshmen and incoming freshmen will be required to take a semester of Public Speaking, Health/Wellness and (with the assistance of the counselors) develop their educational/career plan. This plan will assist the student in appropriate course placement based on skills, assessment results, inter-



ests and scheduling availability. Our graduation requirements of 28 credits will still remain in place. The 28 credit requirement is the highest requirement in the metro area (Olathe 24, Blue Valley 24, Shawnee Mission 23, Sumner 25) and one of the highest in the state. Students who are selecting the Scholars Diploma route will be required to take 31 credits.

Upcoming test dates:

February 9, 2013 – ACT test (won't be offered at PHS but students can take elsewhere) – registration deadline January 11, 2013.

January 26, 2013 – SAT test (not offered at PHS but students can take elsewhere) – registration deadline December 28, 2012.

Scholarships:

FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) – SENIORS ONLY:

Parents – get your taxes done early in 2013 if you plan to fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA www.fafsa.gov). The information will be required on the application.

Save the date for College Goal Sunday (www.collegegoal.org)! From 2-4 on Sunday, February 24 at KCKCC, get assistance completing the FAFSA.

To quicken the process of completing the FAFSA, go online now to request your PIN to apply for federal aid by going to www.pin.ed.gov.

www.fafsa4caster.ed.gov – This web site will estimate the financial aid that you would qualify for.

KCKCC Enrollment and Payments:

Students enrolled for college classes must have all enrollment paperwork turned in before classes start in January.

Payments are handled through the KCKCC Business Office. Fees must be paid in order for students to enroll in classes the next semester. Please take care of these in a timely manner.
