## Student Organizations/Clubs

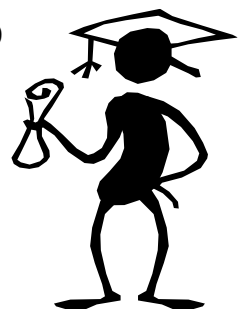
- The Drama Club has chosen their cast for the Spring play, “Your Guests Are Ghosts.” Practices start next week.
