Course "Textbook" Descriptions

Note from SASI of KY-951: The descriptions below are strictly tied to each actual book that is published for AFJROTC. Because KY-951 (located at Christian County High), is a "Traditional Schedule" school. KY-951 will be considered "Blended" to ensure the most JROTC courses are offered for all cadets to take (to maximize enrollment). Cadets will be placed in a class that ensures no class/curriculum is repeated (per HQ guidance). It is possible to take what is considered a "Third-Year" course for your second year and a "Second-Year" course for your third year of JROTC, to ensure curriculum requirements are met.

Aerospace Science

AS 100 - Aviation History: This is a history of Airpower course designed to acquaint the student with the development of flight and the role of the military in that history.

AS 200 - Science of Flight: This course is designed acquaint the student with aviation weather, the human requirements of flight, principles of flight, and air navigation

AS-220 – Global Awareness: The final course is designed to acquaint cadets with the geographic, historical, cultural, political, religious and economic issues of regions around the world. The course also provides an understanding of the United States' relationship to these regions.

AS 300 - Exploring Space: This course begins with astronomy including a detailed examination of Earth's solar system. It also includes the latest advances in space technology and the continuing challenges of manned and unmanned space flight.

AS 400 – Management of the Corps: Cadets will manage the Cadet Corps.

Leadership Studies

LE 100 – Introduction to AFJROTC: Study includes the development of communication skills, Air Force customs and courtesies and cadets' corps activities. Issues include individual self-control, citizenship, wellness, health and fitness.

LE 200 – Intercommunication Skills: Subjects stress communication skills, time management, and cadet's corps activities. Issues discussed include communication skills, individual behavior, group behavior, and basic leadership concepts.

LE 300 – Life Skills: Focus of this course is life after high school Issues discussions include choosing your path, the job searches, financial planning, and career opportunities

LE 400 – Principles of Management: Fourth year students take cadet jobs to practice newly learned leadership and management skills. Issues include management techniques and decisions, management functions and managing yourself and others.

Health and Wellness

AS &LE I/II/III/IV: Health and Wellness education is provided as part of all AS and LE classes. All cadets will participate in all health and wellness activities and these activities are graded. Students will complete health Questionnaire and permission form.
