Chapter 2 MISSION, OBJECTIVES, & GOALS of AFJROTC

The **mission** of the Air Force Junior ROTC (AFJROTC) program is **"Develop Citizens of Character Dedicated to Serving Their Nation & Community."**

The mission of KY-951 is to strive to exceed the AFJROTC mission through our commitment to "Developing Citizens of Character." KY-951 defines character as "The ability to understand right from wrong, the courage to choose right over wrong, and the toughness to follow that decision through." Furthermore, KY-951 instructors are committed to motivating cadets to show Respect, Responsibility, and Dedication through education, leadership, and community service.

Respect is demonstrated in relationships with school faculty, JROTC staff, and other students. Simply defined, respect is treating every person we meet with the same respect we expect for ourselves. The instructors and cadet officers of KY-951 have very strong convictions that any good citizen has respect for themselves and others, and that without respect, nothing worthwhile can be achieved.



KY-951 cadets will know that 15-minutes early is "On-time" or you are LATE!!



The goal of AFJROTC is to instill in high school students that values of citizenship, service to the United States, personal responsibility, and a sense of accomplishment.

To meet the last section of this chapter (Goals – sense of accomplishments), the KY-951 cadet staff will meet the last month of the school year to select unit specific goals for the upcoming year. Annual goals will support three different areas/objectives and address requirements of community, school, unit, and cadets. *All goals should be clearly <u>identifiable</u> and <u>measurable</u> (SMART).*

*These three categories are required for each school year; the annual goals are published into Wings as a requirement from HQ AFJROTC.

** The actual goals will be listed on the "Cadet Bulletin Board" and as many public/common areas as possible for easy access to the cadets.

***Remember, the results of the six required goals must be reported to HQ AFJROTC by 10 April each year. Try to avoid setting goals that cross academic years.
