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Course Title: Intro to Theatre, Advanced Theatre Grade Level: 9-12

#### **Course Description:**

Taking a Theatre class is a great opportunity for students to explore their inner voice and develop into young adults who are able to express themselves in a competent and confident way. It is an exciting class not only because it is entertaining, but also because it is based on human experience. Students enroll in Theatre for various reasons. Some hope to prepare for a career in the theatre and/or learn more about themselves, their talents, and their abilities to work together with their peers while others merely take the course to meet their Fine Arts requirement. Either way, the study of acting is a unique process that helps students become comfortable, assertive, creative, problem solving individuals.

- C = Satisfactory and complete. Shows interest in class.
- D = Minimum effort. Seldom responds in class.
- F = Unacceptable work. Rarely responsive. 0 = No work. Tries to be invisible.

### **Assignments 50%**

Written work is graded on the clarity of the work (ex: blocking in a script); format, grammar, spelling, and mechanics count.

Tests and quizzes are occasionally given to evaluate the student's understanding of Theatre Vocabulary.

Students are never graded on "talent." A performance rubric is used to grade performances.
