South Christian Elementary is located in a rural area of South Christian County. Our population primarily consists of students from a military SY 2015-2016 Page 5

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or rural background. A percentage of our population lives in the Oak Grove area with the remaining from the surrounding area. Some families are not able to travel to school frequently due to the cost of travel. With so many of our students associated with the military, we have a large transitional student population. Our educational program is designed to meet the needs of this transitional population with extensive formative testing to track progress of each student. Nearly 12% of our students have an Individual Educational Plan. 6% of South Christian students are English Language Learners South Christian qualifies for a Free Breakfast and Lunch Feeding Program due to our high number of socioeconomically disadvantaged students. .

The district helped to fund curriculum materials and resources such as Explorations in Non- Fiction Writing and the Reading Intervention programs. The district committed to a 3 year funded position of an Instructional Behavioral Coach who works side by side with teachers to incorporate researched based strategies that increase student achievement. The district has also allocated time and resources to creating pacing guides, curriculum maps, High Impact Instruction, Assessment of Literacy, Positive Behavior Intervention Support, and district benchmark assessments to ensure rigorous and engaging instruction.

Teachers are involved in professional conversations weekly to discuss school and student goals. Strategies and activities are examined and monitored through the Response To Intervention process in order to meet individual student needs. Once a month, time is allotted to discuss and gather evidence for Program Review. The Arts and Humanities and Practical Living are authentically infused in all content areas. The Site Base members meet monthly to discuss school progress. Also, the school hosts a monthly Parent Coffee and Lunch and Learn parent session to discuss educational trends and ways to strengthen the home to school connection.
