

While the 6th grade has been away at camp, it has left some valuable open time in the computer lab, which the 2nd and 3rd grades have leaped into. On Monday we fit all 5 of the second grades in the library to watch a Brain POP short movie about fossils; what they are, how they are made and how old they are. Some children are already quite knowledgeable about fossils, especially dinosaurs, but they learned that there can be fossils of just about anything. Brittany Williams showed us the internet site where many fossils are found, and the 2nd graders were ready to start digging for fossils to find real ones in the buckets of dirt which came from the mines in the internet site. After finding many fossils, the children are now filling up the computer lab and trying to match their real fossils with many online pictures of real fossils.

Dear Parents,

The Triton Regional School Committee is currently searching for the next Superintendent of Schools. To help with this most important decision, they are seeking representatives from the district community to serve on an advisory committee, which will be responsible from narrowing the semi-finalist field of eight to ten candidates then from three to five finalists.

This difficult task will require that the representative commit to the interview schedule. *Only those representatives who participated in all interviews will be allowed to take part in the finalist selection.*

The Search Advisory Committee will be comprised of seventeen individuals representing various groups within the district community. The committee will meet with the search advisor, Mike Gilbert from the Massachusetts Association of School Committees, on Wednesday, January 27, at 7:30 pm to review the selection criteria and compose questions for the interviews.

The interviews will take place on February 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 (if necessary). Interviews will be scheduled beginning at 6:00pm each evening and ending no later than 9:45pm. Each interview will last one hour and there will be a fifteen-minute break between interviews. The selection of the three to five finalists will occur immediately after the last interview.



From easy readers to picture books, to best sellers and more, the Scholastic Book Fair connects students with books they want to read. Each child will visit the book fair with his or her class and will have the opportunity to purchase books for home or school. Proceeds from the fair help to provide books and other enrichment supplies for our library and classrooms.

WHEN WILL MY CHILD VISIT THE FAIR?

Students generally visit the fair during their classroom's library special time. Some classes will visit during alternate times. Your child's teacher will notify you of the specific time at the fair for that class.

HOW DO I PAY FOR THE BOOKS?

Students may pay with cash or with a check made payable to <u>NES PTA</u>. If a check is sent in without the amount, please note the maximum amount in the memo section or with a separate note. We will fill in the amount and send home the amount for your records.

Parents may also purchase books using a credit card, but must be present to use this option.

If your child forgets his or her money, they may bring home a "wish list" and purchase the book(s) the next day.

ARE PARENTS INVITED TO THE FAIR?

Parents may come to the fair at any time during the week. All parents must sign in at the office before heading to the fair.

WHAT IS A TEACHER WISH LIST?

Our teachers have been asked to identify books that they would like for their classroom libraries. Our NES families may purchase books on behalf of the teacher. Many families find that this is a nice way to recognize the hard work and efforts of their children's teachers. Check out the Teacher Wish List table at the fair to see if your child's teacher has a book in mind for the classroom.

WHAT ARE THE FAIR HOURS?

The Book Fair will be open from Monday, November 16 - Thursday, November 19 from 8 am - 4 pm. Additional evening hours will be offered on Wednesday, November 18 from 6 pm - 8 pm. On Friday, November 20, the fair will be open from 8 am - 11:40 am only.
