Week-long 'Hour of Code' campaign lures millions of U.S. students to computer coding

Millions of students from kindergarten through 12th grade are learning computer code this week as part of "Hour of Code," a nationwide campaign embraced by President Obama and featuring free tutorials by Facebook founder Mark Zuckerberg and Microsoft titan Bill Gates that are designed to get U.S. students interested in computer science.

Through its Web site, "Hour of Code" offers lessons in computer coding that are aimed at every age group and accessible on a range of devices, from tablets to desktops. Entire schools have been holding "Hour of Code" sessions for their students. Students also have been logging on at home.

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Fourth Grade Update...

Math: Fourth grade students have been investigating the different methods that can be applied to multiplying multi-digit multiplication problems. Some of these methods include the box method, the lattice method, the distributive property, and the traditional algorithm. After weeks of practice, the students consider themselves to be multiplication masters! The students have been continuing work on solving multi-step word problems, with a specific focus on explaining mathematical thinking in writing. Students are now switching their focus to the inverse operation of division. The students will continue this investigation through the holiday season and beyond.

Reading & Writing: In Reading, fourth grade students have been practicing citing specific text evidence to support their comprehension. Two significant projects that they have recently completed are the character trait poster project and a cause and effect investigation project. In Writing, students have continued their exploration of the three different genres of writing. In particular, students have been working very hard synthesizing their knowledge of the Northeast region of the United States into a well-written expository writing piece! As you wander down the fourth grade hallway, you can observe the magnificent display of these pieces!

Social Studies: In Social Studies, the students are continuing their travel through the United States! Having recently completed the Northeast portion of their yearlong passport project, the students are now heading down to the warmer shores of the Southeast, focusing on the culture, land, and economy of the region.

Science: Prepare for liftoff! After completing a unit on the Earth's changing surface, students will now travel to outer space to get a look at the Earth from the outside in. Several stellar topics will be covered, such as the way that Earth travels and what characterizes each of the planets in our solar system. In January, fourth grade will host a guest speaker who will be bringing in a large, inflatable, model solar system for the students to interact with.


