#### 5th Grade Update...

**ELA/Social Studies:** Our fifth graders are busy in a combined ELA and Social Studies project preparing a persuasive argument for why

"their explorer" should be granted the Explorer of the Century Award. The students are writing a persuasive letter, illustrating their explorer and route map of their travels, and adding in an "interesting facts" section on a poster to be hung in the hallways next week. Be sure to stop by and cast your vote for Explorer of the Century!



**Science:** Science in fifth grade this winter has been quite the productive time! Fifth graders have studied how energy




and nutrients move through ecosystems. They have examined the basic parts of any ecosystem, the roles different organisms play within an ecosystem, and how plants use photosynthesis to create their own energy. Students have also studied how scientists use food chains, food webs, and energy pyramids to illustrate the path of energy in an ecosystem. Students are now finishing the science unit, the energy of living things, by completing a project called "The Food Chain Cafe". In this differentiated project, students

demonstrate their mastery of food

chains, food webs, energy pyramids, and related science vocabu-

lary. Fifth graders will begin studying weather and the water cycle following winter break.



For math in fifth grade students are just finished their second unit which covered decimals. In this unit the students learned to read, write, order and compare decimals to the thousandths place. They even learned to add, subtract, multiply and divide decimals to the hundredths place. Students are now doing a mini-unit on operations and algebraic thinking which covers writing simple expressions and using the order of operations to evaluate the

expressions. Before the vacation and into the new year, their next unit will be fractions.
