

Last week the students in grades 2-6 took part in "The Hour of Code", a global initiative to expose students to the concept of writing code to program computers. This initiative is propelled by many people in the tech industry. Bill Gates, Mark Zuckerberg, many famous sports figures, and personalities, including the president, have taken the challenge to try programming.

Some grades watched short videos showing how software engineers design products and write code to make things such as shoes that light up when touching the ground and coats that have buttons that light up at night, all inventions of people who write code. The code the students wrote was in a game like atmosphere using blocks that have code beneath them. The activities start out very simple and slowly get more and more challenging. A Not So Normal Christmas!


Congratulations to the cast of *A Not So Normal Christmas!* The show was a huge success! The students of NES got to enjoy the show on December 10th and the show continued throughout the
