


## Moby Max at school and at home...

With the fabulous new online tool teachers are using thanks to the generosity of the NES PTA, more and more students are continuing their studies at home. Please remember that the purpose of this tool is to differentiate and meet the direct needs of each student.

Although helping your child out at home can be tempting and may move your child to the next 'level', in the long run, it will not benefit his/her learning. Keep in mind that the design of Moby Max is to get more and more difficult at the student's pace. If you are helping your child answer the questions, the program adjusts the level of work to

your level, not your child's. We have on occasion seen this in school where a student is placed on a level that is not meeting his/her needs. We do encourage you to check out what they are working on with Moby Max, but please encourage your child to do this as an independent activity.





The NES Student Council wants to thank everyone that donated items for the "Coats for Kids" drive this year. The total amount of items that were received was 372. This is about one coat for every two students attending NES. As you know, these coats go to those families that are less fortunate in our community. This program supplies more than 60,000 coats to families in the northeast region. This year was no exception and the NES community should be commended for their support.

#### BASIC RIGHTS WORKSHOP

The Triton SEPAC and the special education department invite you to attend the Basic Rights Workshop on Monday, Feb. 3, 6:30-8:30 pm. It will take place in the Newbury Elementary School library, 63 Hanover St.

This workshop will be presented by the Federation for Children with Special Needs and provides families with an introduction to their rights and responsibilities under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Massachusetts Special Education Law and No Child Left Behind (NCLB). It is designed to help parents learn how to be effective partners with their child's school to decide the child's eligibility for special education, and to plan, make decisions and monitor their child's progress in school.
