sometimes visible to us at night and other times at dawn. Projecting the constellations and the moon phases all around the inside of the planetarium, the fourth grade students were able to interact with the features of our solar system at an arm's reach. In what was a fabulous introduction to our unit of study on the solar system, Mr. Negley asked the students to model the moon's rotation using golf balls and a light bulb. The fourth grade team was ecstatic to have Mr. Negley come share his wonderful knowledge and incredible resources!

Museum of Science Visits NES Third Graders









The 3rd Grade was lucky enough to experience the Museum of Science visiting program "Rock Detectives" this week. In this workshop, students explored the different types of rocks and how they formed over geologic time. Working in small teams, students identified various rocks and minerals through hands-on observations and experiments. For example, they tested rocks with acid, determined whether or not they were hard enough to scratch glass, and held and examined 2 billion-year-old rocks under a microscope! For a finale, they figured out how a particular rock formation has changed over millions of years. The students were very engaged and got a glimpse into some of the techniques geologists use to learn about the Earth and its materials.

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Third Grade Update...

Third graders have been actively engaged in multiplication. Students are learning how to describe and compare characteristics of factors and multiples. They are also working with array models and having fun playing games that focus on the concepts of multiplication and combining equal groups. The children are diligently working toward mastery of their math facts at school and home with the expectation of mastery of multiplication facts through 100. Third graders are mathematicians hard at work!



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The Museum of Science visited NES and presented Rock Detectives to the third graders.
