Welcome Back and Happy New Year!



Welcome back! We hope you all had a relaxing and rejuvenating winter break. The students are back at work and have settled back into the routine nicely. It



is wonderful to hear about all of the exciting adventures NES students have had over the break. Thank you to all who helped get everyone ready to get back into the routine.

Oh, the weather outside is frightful...

As the weather gets colder, it is a good time to remind students to dress for the weather. We try to get students outside for recess, weather permitting. Below is from the section on recess from the NES Student Handbook for you to review.



Recess

Recess is a time for students to get some fresh air, physical activity, and engage in social interactions with peers. All students have scheduled outdoor recess as part of their lunch period, weather permitting. To meet the needs of our students, teachers may elect to have other scheduled recesses in the morning and/or afternoon. All students should come to school dressed appropriately for the weather so they can enjoy themselves outside. A few recess guidelines should be followed for everyone's safety. Students should:

- * Participate in recess unless they have a note authorized from the office or teacher.
- * Play appropriately on playground equipment: take turns, use slide from the ladder side, and stay off the top of the equipment.
- * Play in designated supervised areas.
- * Play in safe areas by staying away from puddles, ice, mud, and the surrounding woods.
- Exhibit pride in the playground area by keeping it free of litter and not eating food.
- * Remain in the playground area unless excused by an adult supervisor.
- * Line up immediately when recess ends.
- * Not play games with unnecessary physical contact (fighting, wrestling, play fighting, tackling, etc.).
- * Not pick up, use, and/or throw any potentially dangerous objects (snow, rocks, sticks, bark, etc.).
- * Bring appropriate clothing, boots, mittens, and snow pants on snowy days.

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Third Grade Update...

Third Grade had an amazing field trip to Old York Historical Society. Students participated in 4 centers around the museum. They baked molasses cookies on the hearth while learning where in the world colonial ingredients

came from and how food was prepared before the invention of modern appliances. Next, students carded wool and spun yarn while learning about how textiles were produced in the 18th century. The third center gave students the opportunity to try out colonial games like ball and cup, Nine Men's Morris, and hoop and stick. Finally, students were given a lesson in the colonial one room schoolhouse. It was a great day!



In Math: We are working on multiplication and division concepts. Students are learning to understand multiplication as the putting together of equal groups, and division as the breaking apart of larger amounts into equal groups. We are working with skip-counting charts, arrays, visual representations, and solving story problems.

In Reading: Students are actively involved in guided reading groups to support their understanding of text. We are also honing our skills with close reading using National Geographic magazine and passages from ReadWorks. Many students are completing a study of folktales from around the world.



In Writing: We are continuing to work with Empowering Writers and most classes are currently learning about Expository and Narrative writing as related to castles. We are also focusing on the correct use of conventions in writing.

In Science: We are just beginning our Sound unit. Students will learn all about sound as a form of energy. They will learn about pitch, how sound travels and how it is muted and amplified. Students will participate in a variety of hands-on activities and will use the scientific method to complete experiments related to sound.



In Social Studies: We are wrapping up our focus on The Pilgrims, the Wampanoag, and early European settlement. Our next unit will focus on the original 13 colonies and many of the famous people associated with the founding of our country.




SIMPLE & SWEET STORYTIMES (Ages 3-5, siblings welcome)

PARENT PICK UP AT BRADFORD:

SCHEDULED DATES:

 \cdot Friday afternoons, January 9 (NES 1/2 day), 16, 23, 30, February 6 (NES 1/2 day) and 13.

TRANSPORTATION:

· All students must ride the bus to Bradford.

EQUIPMENT:

 \cdot Please bring equipment to the school no later than 2:00 pm on Friday (11 am on January 9 and Feb 6). The outside door to the little gym will be open by 7:45 am to drop off equipment.

PARENT PICK UP AT NES:

 \cdot NES buses should arrive back at the school around 6:30 pm.



· PICK UP LOCATION AT NES - at the round part of the school. Park in parking spots only so buses can get into the circle. You will be notified if this location changes for any week.

·Please be prompt in picking up at NES.

Parents may choose to pick up their children at Bradford instead of having them take the return bus to NES.

- · **IMPORTANT**: Student must be signed out by parent at the NES table and turn in ticket no later than 5:45 pm.
- · Any student being picked up at Bradford or NES by someone other than his/her own parent must have a note releasing the student to that person.
- · Every student must be accounted for before the buses leave Bradford. We cannot leave a student at Bradford without seeing the responsible adult.

CANCELLATIONS:

- · Cancellation decisions are made by 11 am on Friday. An announcement will be made at school if the program is cancelled for the day, and an email will be sent out from nesskiprogram@gmail.com.
- \cdot Please discuss in advance your alternate end of day arrangements should the need to cancel occur. Remember, ski equipment cannot go home on the afternoon buses and arrangements must be made to pick up equipment stored at the school.
