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Third Grade Update...

Science: Our sound unit has culminated with the well-loved musical instrument project which helps the students to synthesize their understanding of sound concepts. Your children did an amazing job to produce not only creative instruments, but well written research reports.





Social Studies: The American Revolution is an exciting period in Massachusetts history. The third graders will be going back in time and learning about what life was like during that time period and how Newbury and the surrounding towns played a part in it all. We will be focusing on the thirteen colonies and the causes of the revolution.

Math: We will be finishing up our unit on geometry and measurement soon. Students have learned the concepts of area, perimeter, measurement with rulers as well as liquid measure. Our next unit will focus on fractions. These lessons lend themselves very well to hands on lessons and projects. We are continuing to implement Moby Max in school and encourage practice at home as well. Just a helpful reminder that mastery of math facts is a foundational skill that has impact on real-life situations. The expectations are that all third grade students will have mastery of their addition, subtraction, and multiplication facts to 10.





PARCC: PARCC testing begins next week. We have been busy preparing your children to take both the ELA and Math tests. We have reminded them that this is the first time for all of us taking and giving this state test and that all we ask of them is to do their best and be confident in all of the learning they have accomplished this year so far.

Attorney Moor's practice is devoted entirely to working with families to ensure that students in Massachusetts receive the educational services to which they are entitled. She routinely consults with families about educational and civil rights matters, represents families during negotiations with school districts, as well as at disciplinary and manifestation hearings, hearings before the Bureau of Special Education Appeals, and in state and federal court. Did you know?

Last Saturday, March 14th, two Newbury Elementary School Destination Imagination teams traveled to Greater Lawrence Technical High School in Andover, MA to compete in the Region

5 Destination Imagination Tournament. Destination Imagination, a program that encourages challenge-based problem solving, presents teams with a challenge to which they must respond entirely independent from adult interference. At the tournament, both The Sound Surfers and Team Scream presented their Central Challenge performance, which they have been working on for many months, in addition to responding to an Instant Challenge, a problem they were assigned to solve onsite.

The Sound Surfers, comprised of Vincent M., Edward Z., Cole J., Patrick S., Nicholas H-B., and Patrick W. competed in the "Making Waves" challenge. Over the course of the past few months, the team worked together using the engineering design process to build a functioning sound machine that would produce two different sounds. Additionally, they wrote and performed a skit about traveling into the sound dimension, were required to demonstrate a change of narrative pace in their skit, and planned and displayed two visual representations of sound waves during their performance. We are very proud to announce that The Sound Surfers placed second in their challenge at the regional tournament. Congratulations, Sound Surfers!

Team Scream, composed of Frankie V., Jack H., Sam M., Alex Y., Alex F., and Will S., competed in the "Feary Tales" challenge. Over the past several months, the team worked together to craft a fairy tale about a character dealing with a phobia. Moreover, the team collaborated to create an expressive piece of artwork and a functional piece of artwork, both of which had to woven into their fairy tale. Lastly, the team had to incorporate an illusion into their story. Choosing to create a fairy

tale about a version of Santa Claus who has a phobia of the ever-popular Elf on the Shelf, we are proud to announce that Team Scream placed second in their challenge and are advancing to the Massachusetts State Tournament on Saturday, March 28th. Good luck, Team Scream.

Congratulations to both The Sound Surfers and Team Scream for all of their hard work over the past several months and for wonderfully representing Newbury Elementary School at the Regional Tournament. Keep up the great work!
