Performance Attire: All students should wear plain white shirts and black pants or skirts.

Who: The Spring Concert will include the Advanced Band, Beginner Band, Triton District Stage Band, Chorus, and the Choir.

When: Tuesday, May 26th at 7:00 P.M. All students should arrive at the school by 6:30 P.M.

A rehearsal/performance for the faculty and student body will take place during the school day from 1:00-3:00. Children wear their regular school clothes for this daytime concert.

Pre-School Update...

Ahoy, mates! The preschoolers are busy learning all about the Blue Whale (the largest mammal on earth!). We discussed their physical characteristics, where they live and what they do. We are also busy practicing

songs and dances for our big June production here on the NES stage. The preschoolers would love to wish a safe and fun summer to all!





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Fourth Grade Update...

Math: All fourth grade students have moved to studying geometry. Beginning with angle types, different kinds of lines, and basic geometry vocabulary, the students have begun to identify polygons, measure angles, classify their angle measurements, and create heretofore unseen polygons using Power Polygons. They have completed polygon scavenger hunts, and have worked to internalize all of their new geometry vocabulary. Moving forward, fourth graders will learn to identify and calculate missing angle measurements, continue to investigate the properties of different polygons, and continue to review all of the important fourth grade math skills they have learned this year.

Writing: In Writing, fourth graders have been working hard to practice comparing and contrasting paired texts. From working on comparisons of different versions of myths, historical nonfiction pieces on the Peshtigo Fire and the Great Chicago Fire to completing comparative pieces on the history of hamburgers and tacos in America, fourth graders have been working on using text evidence to support claims. All fourth grade students are currently synthesizing their knowledge about myths, Greek gods and goddesses, and narrative writing structure in order to create their own myth that explains a natural phenomenon.

Social Studies: The fourth grade students have very recently completed their study of the West region, focusing on its land features, economic industries, and cultural traditions. Following this same pattern of study for all regions of the United States, the students have now completed their travels of the United States! They have also very recently completed the State Float Project, an assignment that had the students combine research with creative thinking to create a float to represent one state and many of its facts. Please stop by the NES lobby to see the fruits of their labor!

We will end the year with a study of Canada, Mexico, and by creating a large map of the United States, combining all of the incredible knowledge the students have amassed over the last several months of study.

Science: Since our last NEWT update, we have completed our rotating Science block and all students have now returned to their homerooms for Science. Fourth graders are currently working to understand classifying and identifying plants and animals. Using Keys to Literacy two-column notes and answering questions in response to readings, the students have begun to appreciate an understanding of basic plant function. Moving forward, we will be implementing several interactive activities in which the students will learn more about the characteristics of plants and animals and the way that those characteristics can be used to classify a variety of different species.

Reading: "You're opening Pandora's Box!" "Wow! That was a Herculean effort!" "You've got the Golden Touch!" If you've strolled down the fourth grade wing recently, you will have likely heard these phrases. Fourth grade students have been studying Greek mythology and learning about the idiomatic allusions that have sprung forth from the myths they've read. Focusing on identifying character traits and aligning specific text evidence to prove their case, all fourth graders have continued to develop their skills in written responses to reading. Moreover, the students have been focusing on separating main ideas from details by completing summaries of each myth they have read.

We will end the year with one more round of reading groups, during which the students will complete one more chapter book in the fantasy genre.


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PTA Update...
