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Sixth Grade News

SIXTH GRADE SCIENCE



Sixth grade science students have been working on our *describing and measuring matter* unit. They enjoyed sharing their lab results on how they separated various mixtures. We are now exploring properties of matter while practicing each part of the *scientific method* in our penny lab. Students are testing different liquids for surface tension. Along with their labs, students are designing instructional vocabulary posters using elements from Keys to Literacy. We are creating a word wall for science terms. We will be studying density soon and learning how to use triple beam balance scales! The students are looking forward to creating their own density towers!

SIXTH GRADE MATH



Sixth graders have been learning about the relationship between fractions, decimals and percentages. They are solving real world problems involving the comparison of various quantities. Students have created mini-presentations for the class in which they explain their thinking and the strategies they used in solving such problems. Some students have been coaching their classmates in utilizing standards for mathematical practice after working with Mrs. Paige to solve problems in the "Think Tank" program. Emma H. and Wally Z. have recently taught their classmates about the standard "Making sense of problems and persevere in solving them," as they created problems for the class to wrestle with. As Wally pointed out, "A problem can be really hard at first, but if you persevere, it feels really good when you finally figure out the solution." Students are now focusing on the standard "Make viable arguments and critique the reasoning of others." This standard is about justifying one's thinking, and having dialogue about the ways in which others perceive the same situation. I would like to thank Mrs. Cotter, Mrs. Olson, Mrs. Gigandet, Mr. Van Etten, and Mrs. Lopes for volunteering to work with students who have been using the chrome books to practice Online Math League and to work on Moby Max during math flex blocks. Opportunities to volunteer in December will be emailed home soon.

SIXTH GRADE ELA AND SOCIAL STUDIES






