The Newbury Elementary School Ski & Snowboard Program is open to students in grades 4, 5 and 6. Students travel by bus to Bradford Ski Area in Bradford, MA on six Friday afternoons from 3 – 6 pm beginning January 5th. This program is coordinated by parent volunteers who monitor the buses, the lodge, and the slopes. *The program will be limited to the first 70 students*.

Students may purchase the lift only option or they may take lessons. Lessons are available for beginners through advanced and class sizes are generally small. Beginners must take lessons. Rentals are also available from Bradford, although many local ski shops have rental packages for the season. Ski helmets are required for all NES participants. These may also be rented at the ski area.

Information about the program will go out the week of October 21st and **will be due no later than Tuesday, November 12th**. Please consider volunteering. Our students really enjoy this program!

Second graders have been digging into learning! In Science, we've begun the year with a focus on fossils. The children have learned that dinosaur bones are just one type of fossil, along with plants and much more. A highlight of this unit of study is when second graders have a chance to become paleontologists, sifting through materials from a real dig site in Aurora, North Carolina. How amazing to find pieces of coral, shells, and the teeth of whales and sharks, all millions of years old!

Each class has also been digging into the routines of second grade including Morning Meeting, Trick Word Rings, Pocket Day, and Science Journals. Classmates have been uncovering each other's interests and talents, while teachers have also been discovering children's strengths and needs. We've just begun to unearth all the treasures of second grade!

Second grade artists began the school year with a printing project. They worked very hard to create a printing plate of their initial. Once the cutting and gluing were done, they used crayons to rub over the plate and transfer the image to a piece of paper. SEPAC Meeting on Monday, October 21st

The Triton Special Education Parent Advisory Council (SEPAC) will meet Monday, Oct. 21, at 6 pm in the Newbury Elementary School Library. The SEPAC is open to parents, staff, and community members who have an interest in improving the understanding of students will special needs.

The business meeting will include officer elections and a discussion of SEPAC plans for the year.

Following the meeting, there will be a presentation, "Taking Care of Those Who Can't Take Care of Themselves", by Allan Knowles, an estate planning attorney, who specializes in special needs planning. This presentation will seek to address the steps you can take to ensure that your children are taken care of physically, emotionally and financially once you are gone. Some of the topics to be addressed are:

- General durable power of attorney for financial affairs
- Durable power of attorney for health care Control Disposition of your assets
- Naming an executor to carry out your wishes
- Drafting a letter of intent
- The importance of a will to prevent the state from controlling who gets your assets, and
- Care and beneficiary designations so that inheritance does not disqualify your child from state and federal benefits.
