

First Grade Art News

ONE SHAPE, TWO SHAPE, OVERLAP, NEW SHAPE!

First graders started the year with a mosaic design that explored the concept of overlapping. They traced one shape on a piece of paper and then traced another shape that partially overlapped it. They then colored the three areas of their paper with different colored mosaic squares.



Spooky Halloween Jack-O-Lantern Collages have been created with the theme of opposites. Students have learned about cutting on the crease and about folding paper to make two identical shapes. Ask them how many opposites there are in their pictures.





Next, we will be getting ready for the cold weather by designing two sets of matching mittens.


Try your luck! Sports Package Drawings
