### SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

The Triton Regional School District serves the Massachusetts coastal towns of Newbury, Rowley and Salisbury. Located in the northeast corner of the state, these three communities provide a distinct population of students to the school district. With all three rural towns dating back to the 1630's, the area is rich in historical traditions and attractions which add to the academic experience of our students.

The student population for the Triton District in 2010-2011 was 3059 with 94% white, and 6% African American, Hispanic, Native American, or Asian American. The Triton High School teaching staff is a dedicated group of educators, three-quarters of who hold advanced degrees. The average teacher/student ratio is 14:1, with an average student load of 110. The percent of teachers licensed is 97%, and 99% of the teachers in the core academic subjects are Highly Qualified under NCLB.
