2016 Advanced Placement Exams

The Advanced Placement (AP) Exams will be given at Hackett beginning Monday, May 2, and will continue through Thursday, May 24, 2016. AP Exams are required for all students who are currently enrolled in an AP course. Students with documented learning disabilities who have regularly used accommodations in school should contact Mrs. Ulbrich, ASAP, if they would like to apply for accommodations for AP Exams. Documentation must be up to date (within the last three years for either an initial diagnosis or a reconfirmed diagnosis) and all past and current documentation must be on file in our office.

Junior College Visits

Now is a good time for juniors to plan visits to their prospective colleges. Hackett allows three absences for this purpose during their second semester; these are treated as school-related business. It's best to call ahead and schedule a meeting with the admissions office. While students are wise to start their college search online, visiting a college may be key when deciding if a particular school is the right fit for you. A typical visit includes a tour of campus, attending a class, speaking with an admissions officer, and meeting with an athletic coach. When choosing a college, you should consider: academic curriculum, admission policy, cost, opportunity for financial aid. location, size of enrollment. reputation in a specific field, and affiliation (such as private, public, religious, etc.).

FAFSA/College Financial Aid

Senior Parents: It is time to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form for your senior. The form, which is the center of most grants, loans,

scholarships and other need-based financial aid, is available on-line at www. fafsa.ed.gov Students planning to attend college or postsecondary training during the 2016-2017 academic school year should complete the online FAFSA by March 1. You should also be aware of your individual college deadlines for financial aid, which may be earlier. Check with the Financial Aid Office at your particular college. All applications are processed online.

Scholarships

As scholarship opportunities are received, they are posted to the HCP Daily Announcements by the Guidance Department. While a majority of these opportunities are directed toward seniors, we occasionally post scholarships which are available to underclassmen. Please be aware of scholarship scams. Do not pay anything to anyone to search for scholarships. Juniors and seniors: we have listed some of the more popular scholarship web sites which are available to you in the Hackett College Planner that you were given at Junior Parent Night.

Career Cruising

This year, Hackett Catholic Prep has made available to all our students a new web-based program called Career Cruising (CC), a comprehensive tool to aid them in searching careers, colleges and universities, scholarships, and more!

Freshmen students have assessed their learning style. Sophomore students have found careers that match their current interests and have learned to see if they have the skills to match their interested careers. Junior students access the site's college search for recommendations based on their intended career/degree. Senior students are finding the financial aid section of particular interest—they've already tried out the Financial Aid Selector, where they located programs they may be eligible for based on gender, residency, ethnicity, etc.

CC will also be used this year for 2016-2017 HCP class scheduling for underclassmen, beginning the week of January 25th.

SAT Practice Test

As a fundraiser for Alternative Spring Break, Hackett Catholic Prep's Guidance Office is offering an SAT practice test on Saturday, February 20th. We strongly encourage our students to take advantage of every opportunity to practice their test-taking skills so that they are prepared for the rigors of an actual standardized test.

Students should arrive at 7:40am with their ID. The testing will take approximately 4 hours and 15 minutes.

The cost is \$25.00 when registering prior to February 17th, or \$35 at the door (depending on availability). To pre-register for this test, please use the "Practice SAT Test" link on Hackett's homepage to complete the online registration form.

Your registration will be complete upon receipt of your payment, either by cash, check made payable to Hackett Catholic Prep, or via Hackett's Pay Portal. (A link to the Pay Portal can be found on the left side of Hackett's website homepage. Please use the location titled "Hackett Guidance Fees".)

Method Test Prep

The redesigned SAT, debuting March 2016, is designed to assess your academic readiness for college, and provide a path to opportunities, financial support, and scholarships. HCP juniors will be taking the test free of charge in April. Log onto Method Test Prep today and get prepared for this important exam! Just 15 minutes a day on Method Test Prep can help you increase your SAT score by over 150 points, which means opening up your college options!

Congratulations, Caroline! Class of 2016


Hackett Catholic Prep's senior. Caroline Yapp, has been chosen as one of only two students to represent the State of Michigan at the United States Senate Youth Program. Each year this competitive, merit-based program brings 104 high school students to Washington, D.C. for an intensive week-long study of the federal government and the people who lead it. While in Washington the student delegates attend meetings and briefings with Senators, House of Representatives and Congressional staff, the President, a Justice of the Supreme Court and senior members of the national media. The overall mission of the program is to help instill within each class of USSYP student delegates a more profound knowledge of the American political process. In addition to the program week, The Hearst Foundation provides each student with a \$5,000 undergraduate college scholarship with encouragement to continue coursework in government, history or public affairs. Past delegates include former presidential advisor Carl Rove and New Jersey Governor Chris Christie.


