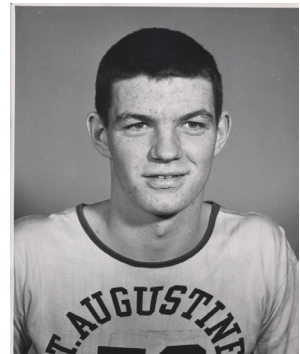


Athletic Hall of Fame 2009 17th Annual Kalamazoo Area Catholic Schools Athletic Hall of Fame Inductees

John Fleckenstein, is a 1957 graduate of St. Augustine High School. John earned All City Honors in basketball in 1957 and baseball in 1956 and 1957. He was the first varsity baseball coach for Hackett in 1965. He also coached basketball in the Catholic system, plus football and basketball for KPS during a 39 year teaching career.



Susan Metzger Tully, a 1957 graduate of St. Augustine, had an outstanding tennis career before the advent of girls' tennis in Michigan high schools. Susan was the 1954 girls national indoor doubles champion, the 1956 girls national 18 grass court doubles finalist. She ranked #1 nationally in the girls 18 division. During her brilliant adult career, she won 5 USTA National doubles championships, 12 USTA National doubles finalists, 1 USTA National singles finalists. She is the president of the National Sr. Womens' association, Womens' 45 Doubles # 1 National ranking. She won the Billie Jean King women's sportsmanship award in 1989.



Tim Eastman, coach, teacher, and principal at Hackett. Tim coached boys and girls swim for a total of 15 years. He coached at Olivet College for 2 seasons. While coaching at Hackett, he was named zone 6 coach of the year for 2001. He coached 5 individual state champs, 15 All State swimmers and 6 individual All Americans. He mentored 23 academic All Americans. All of the current girls' swim records and 6 of the records set by the boy's teams came on his watch.





Tony La Scala, a 1952 graduate of St. Augustine, was a multi-talented athlete winning 3 letters in football, 3 letters in basketball, 3 letters in tennis and 2 letters in track during his high school career. His accomplishments include state doubles finalist in tennis and his role as quarterback and running back on the football team. While in school, he was also on the American Legion baseball team that competed in the state final game. During the 1964 – 1965 school year, he served as the freshman football coach and head basketball coach at HCC. In 1965, he began his thirty year tenure as coach and athletic director at Illinois Benedictine College. He is a member of the Illinois Basketball Coaches Hall of Fame.



Gilbert Hoffman, served 4 years as CAA secretary and 10 years as president in the 1950's and 1960's. He volunteered in football stadium work, ticket taking and assisting with the running of track and cross country meets. His seven children and five grandchildren have been successful participants in the Catholic Education System of Kalamazoo,



Hector Velasquez, a 1959 graduate of St. Augustine, earned 3 varsity letters in football, 3 in baseball, and two in basketball. He was All City in baseball, second team All State in Football. He was also Plainwell's selection as best offensive football opponent. He placed third in the city in scoring.

Nicholas James recently earned his Master CFI accreditation. Nick is a flight and ground instructor with Dodgen Aircraft at Allegan's Padgham Field Airport. He specializes in multi-engine and initial CFI training as well as high performance and complex aircraft checkouts.

To help put this achievement in its proper perspective, there are approximately 92,000 CFIs in the United States. Fewer than 700 of them have achieved that distinction thus far. The last 13 national Flight Instructors of the Year were Master CFIs while Nick is one of only 25 Michigan aviation educators to earn this prestigious "Master" title.

The Master Instructor designation is the only industry professional accreditation recognized by the FAA. It is earned by candidates through a rigorous pro-

cess of continuing professional activity and peer review. Much like a flight instructor's certificate, it must be renewed biennially. This process parallels the continuing education regimen used by other professionals to enhance their knowledge base while increasing their professionalism. Simply put, the Master Instructor designation is a means by which to identify those outstanding aviation educators, those "Teachers of Flight," who have demonstrated an ongoing commitment to excellence, professional growth, and service to the aviation community.

Nick is a 1997 graduate of Hackett and a former cross country coach. He recently became engaged to Jackie Jo Winnell of Paw Paw, Michigan. Congratulations, Nick!

Paul Renbarger, 1935, just wants to say hello to all the 1935 graduates of St. A's. He is 91 years young and in good health.

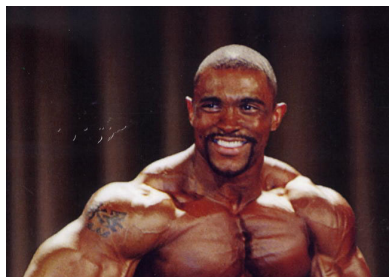

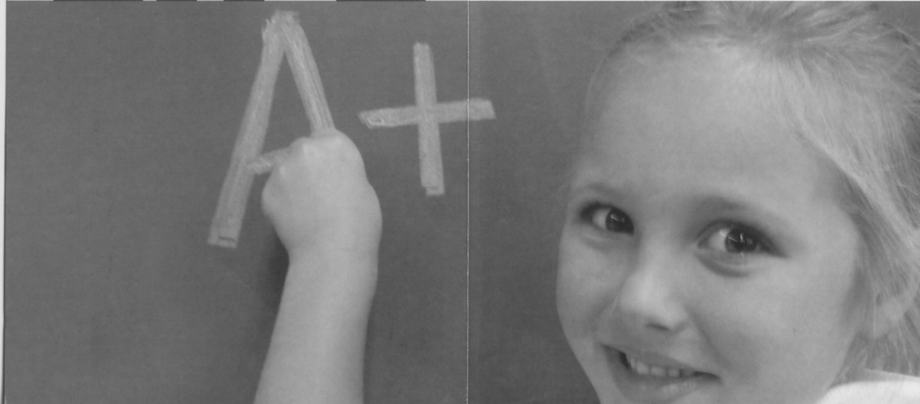

More Jottings

Tommy J. Scanlon, 1971, married Somsanai (Mai) on 12-16-82. We have 2 children, Michael (2-5-94) and Catherina (9-12-99). I have been working for the most part in the overseas international construction management arena. My work has included military bases in the middle Pacific from 1988 through 1991, to my present series of assignments in the new construction of U.S. Embassy Chancery compounds around the world, starting in 1993 with Bogota Colombia, SA, then to Moscow Russia, Eastern Europe, on to Tunis Tunisia, N. Africa, then there is Abuja Nigeria, West Africa, over to Yangon Myanmar, S.E. Asia, and finally back to Africa.

I am a senior electrical manager for the last 8 years on field projects with our regional offices in Dubai. I handle

the management of IT Data & Telecommunication, Technical Security, Building Automation, Low and Medium Voltage Power Distribution Systems, as well as general lighting and electrical services .

My family always travels with me as my assignment generally are 2 1/2 - 3 years running. My children have been educated overseas in the international schooling system. Presently they attend the International Community School of Addis Ababa Ethiopia. School population of 485 children, with children from 65 nations. They have seen the poverty that strickens most the populace of the world, have been directly involved in community affair programs that they participate in and benefit from the rewards of giving to those less fortunate, teaching those who are thirsty for not only food, but understanding, companionship, and learning.

IN HONOR OF LOIS GREIFFENDORF

This is the true reason why Catholic education offers opportunities beyond the academics. We aren't just teaching theology, our students are living the theology of the Church through the gifts of our faith, our parents, and our teachers.

What follows is the gift of faith from our theology teacher Lois Greiffendorf, diagnosed with cancer a month ago. She is the wife of Tom Greiffendorf who is also a theology teacher at Hackett.

Wednesday March 4, 2009

Dear Students:

Thank you so much for the beautiful prayers that you wrote for the prayer book given to me at the Ash Wednesday Mass. I have so enjoyed reading each one. As you probably know by now, last Friday we were told that a new cancerous tumor was found to be growing on the opposite side of my head. Consequently, there will be three areas that radiation will target (including the area that was operated on & an area of concern in the center of the brain that cannot be reached by surgery)-radiation & chemo will both begin this Thursday, March 5. I believe this round of treatment will last for six weeks (5 days per week) – then we will have off a few weeks and begin again, with the entire cycle lasting 12-13 months. Of course, everything depends on how the tumors respond to treatment – and the outcome of the intercessory prayers to God through the Servant of God Pope John Paul III!

As I have thought about what I would like to say to you, I thought about why I began teaching at Hackett – it certainly wasn't because of the pay (!!) or the "easy" hours or work (!) or the "close" drive (!) or because you guys always wanted to hear what I had to say (!), but because I loved God and I loved you and I wanted you to know God and love Him, too. It was a privilege to serve God and bring this Gospel, this Good News, to you. And YES – it is GOOD NEWS, even when things don't go the way we want. This line from St. Paul's letter to the Ephesians always inspired me as a teacher, "For this reason I kneel before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named, that he may grant you in accord with the riches of his glory to be strengthened with power through his Spirit in the inner self, and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith; that you, rooted and grounded in love, may have strength to comprehend with all the holy ones what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God." (Eph 3:14-19) No matter what is going on in your life or in my life, we need to remember that God will take a bad situation and work it to the good; He will help us through it.

Do I wonder why me, why am I facing this cancer? No; why not me? We all know so many who have had tragedies in life and I have had so many blessings. There is always a danger in illness to become self-centered, so when I begin focusing on myself, I try to remember those who are going through more difficult times – particularly young parents facing cancer or children with cancer and I pray for them.

Do I sometimes get scared? Yes. Sometimes when I think about the prognosis and I look at my family, I don't want to leave them! I don't want to leave my husband and daughters. I want my granddaughters to remember all the fun times we have and I want to have more fun times – I want to take them camping!!! When that fear starts coming around, I remember the words of Jesus that Pope John Paul II always repeated, "Be not afraid." Each day I enjoy all the times with my family that I can. I "drink" in the beautiful blue skies we have had lately – and even though I am definitely looking forward to spring – I have appreciated the frost on each limb of the bushes and trees and the way they sparkle in the sunlight.

In the meantime, I pray for God's will in my life and for God's grace to live each day (& to be healed!) And I pray for each of you to be holy men and women of God – to use the gifts and life you have been given to love and serve God and one another. It has been a privilege to get to know you, from the students who were my students for two years who I have watched grow and mature to the students who I was just getting to know this year. I'll miss you all. I offer to you one of my favorite prayers written by St. Ignatius of Loyola. Pray it in sincerity and regularity and it can be transforming:

O Lord, teach me to be generous.
Teach me to serve you as you deserve;
To give and not to count the cost;
To fight and not to heed the wounds;
To toil and not to seek for rest;
To labor and not to ask for reward
Save that of knowing that I am doing
Your holy will. Amen.
