

Board of Directors Election Voting Guide 2019

#### I. Purpose of the Voting Guide

The purpose of this Voting Guide is to provide detailed information on election procedures and introduce you to the Cornerstone Montessori Elementary School Board of Directors candidates. This guide will include a profile of each candidate as submitted by the candidate.

#### II. Eligibility to Vote

Eligible voters are faculty and staff members employed at the school and all parents or legal guardians of children enrolled in the school.

### Parents or Legal Guardians

- Parent is defined as the legal guardian of a student whose address has been given to CMES as the address of record to send school communications.
- Two-parent families with both parents living at the same address will receive two ballots, one per parent.
- Single-parent families will receive one ballot, one per parent.
- Parents living at separate addresses will each receive one ballot, one per parent. This assumes that each parent's address is on file at CMES as receiving school communications.
- Parents who have not registered their address with CMES as an address to send school communications will not receive a ballot. In order to vote, these parents should come to the school and identify themselves to the school director, who will give them a ballot; the director will also add the names and addresses of these parents to the master list of eligible voters as of the date they are identified.

#### Faculty and Staff

 Each CMES faculty and staff member receives one vote. Faculty and staff of the school who are also parents may only vote once.

### **Current Board Member**

- Board members who are also staff, faculty, or parents may only vote once.
- Board members who are not a parent or an employee are also eligible to vote.

### **III. Election Procedures**

The election will be held on May 21, 2019 at Cornerstone Montessori Elementary School. Voting will take place from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm. Voters will sign in and receive their ballot at the front desk. They will then fill out their ballot and place it in the ballot box.

Results of the election will be presented at the Annual Meeting, which will be held at Cornerstone on May 21 at 5:30 pm. All parents, faculty, and staff are encouraged to attend the Annual Meeting.

## **Marcus Almon – Parent Member**

## 1. Why are you interested in serving on the Board of Directors?

# **Amy Dvergsdal – Parent Member**

## 1. Why are you interested in serving on the Board of Directors?

I've been a parent of children at Cornerstone for over 10 years, and currently have children in the Children's House, Lower Elementary and Upper Elementary. I've loved being a part of the Cornerstone community and would welcome a chance to participate in the decisions that will shape the school's future. My hope is that the school can continue the excellent job it does serving a diverse group of children for many years to come, and I would like to work on building ties within the community that can help accomplish that.

### 2. What role might you play in advancing the mission of the school?

I would like to focus on building stronger relationships with businesses, organizations and families in east St. Paul. As a resident of East St. Paul, I value the culturally and economically diverse neighborhood in which Cornerstone is located. I think that schools are an integral part of neighborhoods, and I would like to work on outreach to other organizations with whom we could build partnerships and increase the ways that Cornerstone students can engage with the community.

## 3. What areas of expertise would you bring to the Cornerstone Montessori Elementary School Board?

I've worked at several non-profits providing social services as a case manager, and a large part of my responsibilities included building ties and strengthening relationships between organizations to provide a stronger network of services. I believe those skills would be an asset to the board and the Cornerstone Community.

# 4. What aspects of Cornerstone do you value the most? What role does Cornerstone's foundation as a Montessori school play?

I value the strong commitment Cornerstone has to the children it serves. I think the value placed on children's individualism can clearly be seen in the interactions of the adults who work with the children there – every time I shadow, pick up my children, or attend an educational event or conference. Children are allowed to develop skills at a natural pace while learning about subjects that excite them, and their independence is supported by their teachers. I value the importance Cornerstone places on the environment – both the environment within the classroom, and encouraging the children to value the environment around them. I believe the Montessori foundation of the school, in addition to the hard work of the staff that supports it, provides the building blocks for the strong community that has emerged. Montessori principles support the sense of independence and responsibility that I see in my children and their classmates, and provide a solid academic foundation that allows the children to truly understand the reason behind an answer, not just what the correct answer is.

## 5. What is your vision for Cornerstone's future?

I would like to see Cornerstone continue the work it does - providing a strong Montessori education to a diverse group of children, providing educational programming to the families of the students, while also strengthening ties to the neighborhood. I would also like to work with the board to explore the feasibility of starting an adolescent program.
