It's Cold Out There

That's what we've been hearing from the students since the cold weather finally arrived. Whenever possible, we will be taking the students outside for social time, as it is an important part of their day here at school. To that end, please make sure your students are dressed appropriately for the weather when they leave for school. Everyday on announcements, Mrs. Wright reminds the students to bring their coats, hats and gloves to lunch, since we are not able to send kids back into the building without a pass. Below are our guidelines for when we go out and when we stay in (unless a doctor's note is on file stating that outside recess is not permitted for a medical condition):

If the temperature (including wind chill) is below 20 degrees, recess will take place indoors. If the temperature is 20 degrees or above, outside recess may take place.

Drop off and Dismissal Important Reminders

- Please remember to follow all parking laws on the street.
- If you are dropping a student off on Sublette prior to school, please pull over all the way to the curb to allow for a safe exit from your vehicle.
- If you come onto the lot in the mornings, remember that both lanes are used for drop off, so we ask that you not change lanes.
- Always choose the lane that allows your son/daughter to exit your car onto the outside of traffic, or curb side.
- Students should not arrive at school before 8:10, unless they are checking into before care
- In the afternoon, please avoid using spots that are reserved for handicapped individual. You may only use those spots if you have a handicap placard displayed on your vehicle.
- As always, please pay attention to the staff directing traffic and avoid parking in the crosswalks and the spots reserved for people with disabilities.

Kindergarten Enrollment

Although it may be hard to believe, it is time for K enrollment for the next year (Open Dec 1st officially). If you have a child or know a neighbor or family friend who have a child starting Kindergarten next year (Must turn 5yrs by July 31, 2017), the time to apply is now. Every child must apply through the lottery, whether they are a sibling or not in order to enroll. We want to make sure to reach the siblings of all our current students and all our referrals by the first lottery pull for Kindergarten for next year, which is scheduled to be held on February 1, 2017. Parents can either apply directly on our website via an online application (Online Application is the preferred method), follow the link on parent portal or get an application from the office.

These days will count as Excused Absences at PCS, as long as we have a note from the school documenting their attendance.

Let Me Run for the spring season!

We are excited to offer Let Me Run here at PCS for our 4-8 grade boys once again! In order to have a successful season, we need volunteers who can commit to 1-2 practices a week, after school, (Tues. and Thurs.). Absolutely no experience is necessary. Coaches receive a training manual and materials to guide their weekly practice.

Let Me Run is a seven-week running program for pre-teen and teenage boys, led by trained coaches from your community. Each team meets twice a week for an hour, and the boys exercise and participate in fun activities, which help them learn how to express themselves, reach personal goals, and improve their overall wellness. At the end of the program, the boys celebrate their hard work with a 5k race. There is a training session scheduled for Saturday, February 4th, that is recommended but not required since only one coach per team is required to attend a training each season, and we already have coaches signed
