On the right side of the chart, use at least two (2) evidences from the book to justify the character trait(s) you have chosen. Be sure to note the page numbers of your evidence. These characters and traits will be used to fuel discussion upon returning to school. You are required to capture a minimum of five (5) characters, their traits, and evidence from the book. However, feel free to make additional copies or draw your own chart on paper if more characters grab your attention. (An example has been provided for you! Do not use it as one of your five.)
