Terms for the Week:

Igneous rock- a rock that forms when melted rock cools and hardens.

<u>Sedimentary rock</u>- rock that forms when small bits of matter are pressed together in layers.

<u>Metamorphic rock</u>- rock formed from another kind of rock under heat and pressure.

Fossil fuel- an energy source made from the remains of ancient, once-living things.

Obsidian- smooth and glassy.

Basalt- has small mineral grains in it.

<u>Texture</u>- a property that describes the appearance of a rock.

Mineral- a natural, nonliving substance that makes up rock.

<u>**Bands</u>**- when minerals within rocks get rearranged and pressed into thin layers. They may be straight or wavy.</u>

Sediment- tiny bits of weathered rock or once-living animals or plants.

<u>Coal</u>- a rock that people burn for energy.

Alternative Energy Sources - other ways to produce energy.

<u>Hybrid</u>- something that is formed by mixing or combining two different things. Example: Hybrid cars uses two different power sources Gasoline fuel and electrical energy.
