Integrity is the quality of being honest and having strong moral principles; moral uprightness.

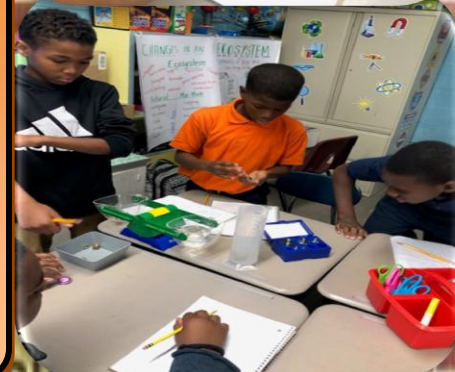
Let's Be Honest

5th graders hard at work in Science Class. As you can clearly see, these students were involved, engaged and vested in learning.

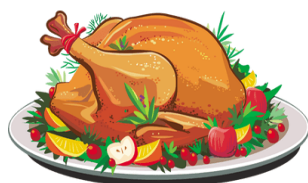
