Safety First

If you have visited Carver within

the past month, you have probably noticed the above pictured keypads at the office and at the entrance of each hallway. These keypads have been added at each school within the district, as an added means of security to ensure that only authorized individuals are in campus buildings. With Carver having a relatively open campus, it is possible for individuals to walk onto campus at any time. However, with these keypads, another layer of protection is added because the individual would need a code or a card to enter the area. The image above to the left is the pad at the main office. There is a button that visitors must press first. A camera on the pad allows the secretaries to see who is attempting to gain entry, and then they can choose to unlock the door. On the right, you will see Nurse Wilson entering her code to enter another hallway. Once a visitor enters the office, another safety measure that they must encounter requires them to give their driver's license or a state-issued ID to the secretary to be scanned by a system that tracks sexual predators. If someone with this record is scanned, the alerts will immediately go the local police department, the school administrators, and district security. Visitors cannot enter the halls without state ID.
