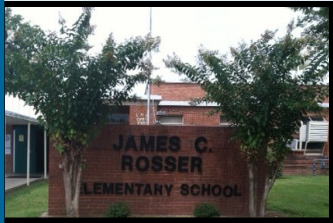

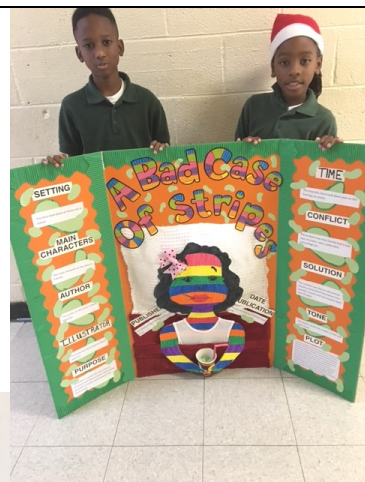

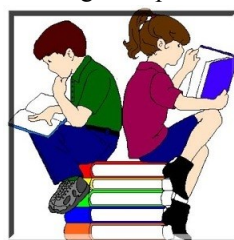


McKinney-Vento Homeless Act
