- All students were able to choose a free RIF book and receive a new bookmark to help keep up with all of their reading.



Our character trait for the month of November is problem solving. One way to be a problem solver is to help someone who is being mistreated or bullied by others. One lesson that I like to use is called, "Be an Upstander" and it gives four ways to help someone who is being mistreated.

- I. Be a Buddy just walk up and stand by the person being mistreated. This will show that he has someone on his side.
- 2. **Interrupt** just walk up and ask the person being mistreated if he want to go shoot basketball or go to the other end of the lunch table.
- 3. **Speak Out** Tell the person who is doing the mistreating that it is not right and to stop. Others will probably notice and come stand with you.
- 4. **Tell Someone** tell an adult close by what is happening and let him/her handle the problem.

These are quick and easy steps to help solve a problem and to be an Upstander.
