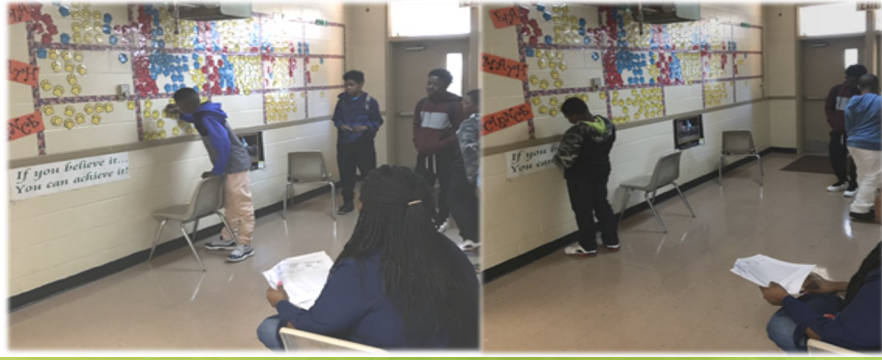
What is responsibility? It is being accountable for what you do, for your actions and behavior. Responsibility is doing the right thing at the right time, so others can trust and depend on you.
