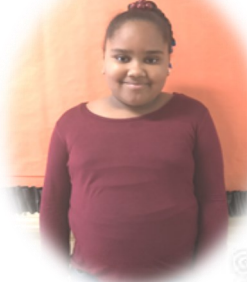

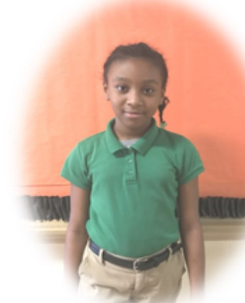

Strategies for Parents

One strategy is having family rules. You are probably thinking that is nothing new, we have rules at our house. I am sure that is true, but do you have those rules posted? From my experience working with families, I can tell you that unless your rules are posted their existence is questionable. During family counseling, parents and children will share their family rules, but they rarely matched perfectly.

A second strategy is having consequences for your child's behavior. Don't forget that consequences are both positive and negative. If your child's behavior is negative, the consequence is negative. If your child's behavior is positive then the consequence is positive. Parents often wonder why they need to use positive consequences. The main reason to using positive consequences is to encourage your child to continue to do that behavior. After all if your boss tells you how they appreciate you staying late to help finish a project, you are more likely to do it again.

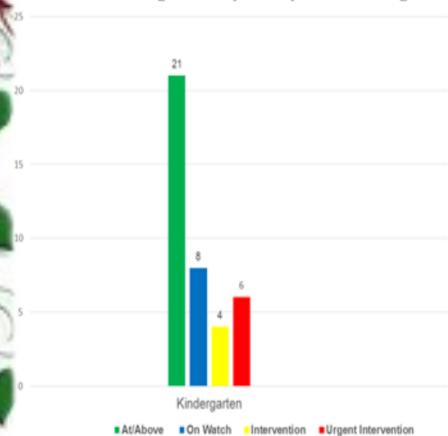

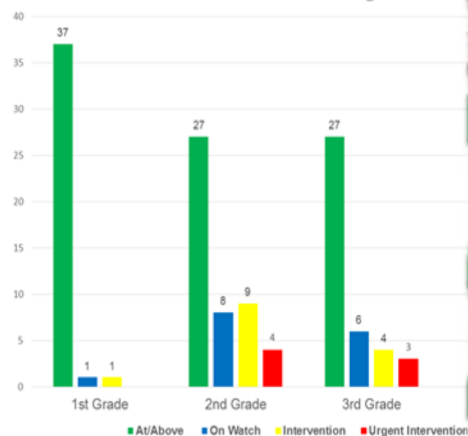

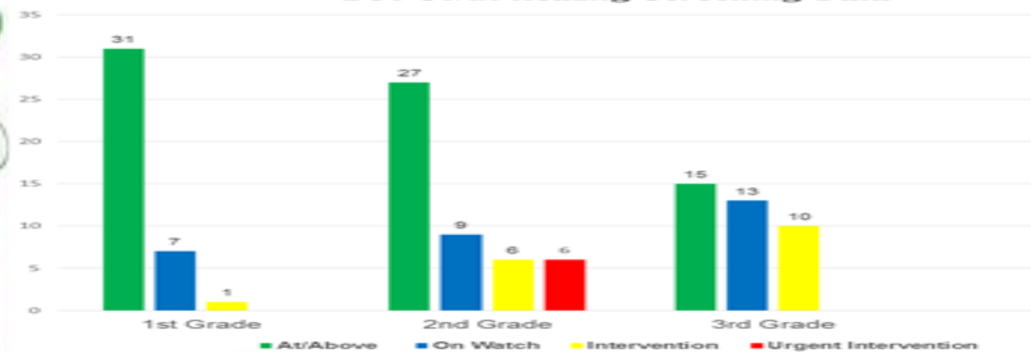
BOY Kindergarten Early Literacy STAR Screening Data



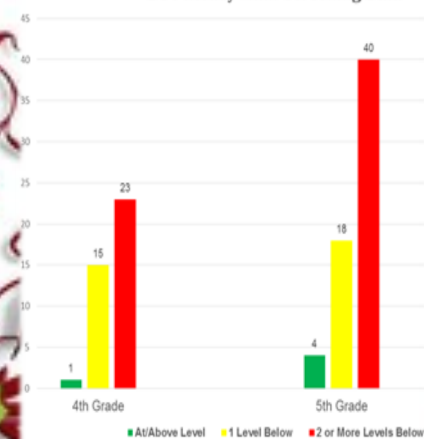
BOY STAR Math Screening Data



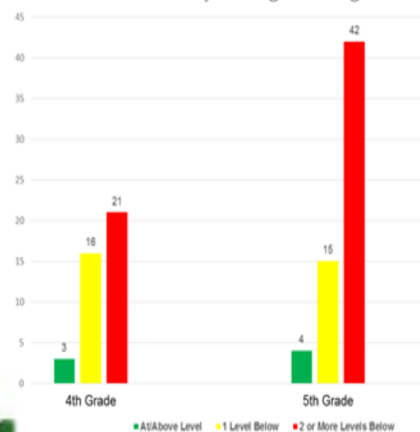
BOY STAR Reading Screening Data
