English	4 Credits I, II, III, IV or a designated combination of 4 courses
Mathematics	4 Credits (Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II) OR (Math I, Math II, Math III) 4 th Math Course to be aligned with the student's post high school plans. A student, in rare instances, may be able to make an alternative math course sequence as outlined under State Board of Education policy. Please see your school counselors for more details.
Science	3 Credits A physical science course, Biology, Environmental Science
Social Studies	4 Credits Civics and Economics, World History, American History I: Founding Principles and American History II OR AP US History**, additional social studies course**
World Languages	Not required for high school graduation. A two-credit minimum is required for admission to a university in the UNC system.
Health and Physical Education	1 Credit Health/Physical Education
Electives or other requirements***	6 Credits required 2 elective credits of any combination from either: - Career and Technical Education (CTE) - Arts Education - World Languages 4 elective credits strongly recommended (four course concentration) from one of the following: - Career and Technical Education (CTE)**** - JROTC - Arts Education (eg. dance, music, theatre arts, visual arts) - Any other subject area (e.g. social studies, science, mathematics, English) Graduation Project (RCS Requirement)*****
