AIG Reading

- ❖ Both fourth and fifth grades have started novels.
- ❖ Outside of class, students are asked to read certain chapters. Other activities involve them recording their thoughts about certain topics read for the purpose of discussion. Class time can then be maximized for digging deeper into text with conversations and activities to develop critical thinking skills.

AIG Math

- ❖ Fourth Grade: Our lessons are pullout classes. The content for instruction aligns with the Common Core standards and are designed to add depth and complexity.
- ❖ Fifth Grade: Fifth graders are presented math instruction through the inclusion model. The lessons are developed around previously taught Common Core standards. During the inclusion time with the AIG specialist, the activities focus on problem or project based type activities.
