

# Grading Guidance for Grades K-11

## High School (9-11)

and non-graduating seniors

## Middle School (6-8)

## Elementary School (K-5)

**If your student was passing as of Q3 (3/13/2020):**

- **Option 1: Choose a numeric grade that counts in GPA**
- **The higher of 2 grades: Q3 grade (this is the grade as of 3/13/2020) OR a grade that is calculated by averaging Q3 and Q4 (remote work that occurred after 3/13/2020)**
- **Option 2: Choose a grade of PC19**
- **A grade of PC19 awards a credit toward graduation, but does NOT count in GPA calculations**

**If your student was failing as of 3/13/2020 and was unable to improve the grade through remote learning:**

- **A grade of WC19 will be issued.**
- **A WC19 does not provide credit toward graduation, but does NOT count against GPA**
- **A PC19/WC19 will be awarded to students who cannot be reached to make a decision.**

**Final Grades - courses taken for middle school credit:**

**If your student was passing as of Q3 (3/13/2020) or was able to improve the grade to passing through remote learning:**

- **A grade of PC19 will be issued for the final grade of the course.**

**If your student was not passing as of Q3 (3/13/2020) and was not able to improve his/her grade through remote learning:**

- **A grade of WC19 will be issued for the final grade of the course.**

**Final Grades- courses taken for high school credit (these courses do not impact high school GPA):**

- **Option 1: Choose a numeric grade (the higher of Q3 or grade as improved through remote learning)**
- **Option 2: Choose a PC19/WC19 based on the higher of grade for Q3 or grade as improved through remote learning**

- **Students will receive no final grades for the 2019-2020 school year**
- **Instead of a final grade, teachers will provide year-end feedback for students regarding learning from the full academic school year, using a format determined locally.**
- **Teachers will document individual student strengths and needs to ensure an effective transition from the spring 2020 remote learning process to the 2020-2021 academic year.**
