1. Monday August 27th is the first day of school. We will open the doors for car riders at 7:20 to begin letting out.

2. We welcome parents to bring your child(ren) in to school so they get comfortable, but we do ask that after the first week, you no longer walk them to class. It is a hard adjustment for the children, but they will get in a routine and it will become second nature for them. We will have multiple staff and safety patrol here to help them get where they need to be.

3. Safety Patrol will be contacted this week for the first part of the year. We will let all students know when they will have safety patrol this year, but we will only call those who will be doing it to start the year. If you don't get a call, that means you are probably doing patrol during another part of the year.

4. We have universal free breakfast at the dale this year, so your child is welcome to eat breakfast with us each and every day.

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5. Trindale has a before and after school daycare. If you are looking for a place for your child to be before school (from 6:30 - 7:30) or after school (2:30 - 6:00pm) please consider the date. We allow parents to drop their kids off early so you can make it to work for only \$2 a day or \$10 a week. Our after school care is \$40 a week. We will have the daycare staff in the gym on Meet the Teacher night so you can ask more questions and register your child.

6. Student Council will be asking all families for clothing donations in our weekly updates. They will be monitoring the needs of our clothes closet and asking you all for specific size and clothing donations. Please help us to keep our closet full. We need these clothes for those who have bathroom accidents, fall into mud puddles, tear their pants, etc. Many kids do not like having to wear other gender clothes or ones too big or small for them. So if you are cleaning out a closet, please think of the date as a possible clothes donation.

7. **PTO** would like to remind you that they are in the process of planning our annual fall festival. We always have a large silent auction, and we need help securing items for the auction. If you own a business or have a connection to a business, they would greatly appreciate help in getting items for the auction. School Procedures:

Each week I will highlight a school procedure just to keep everyone on one the same page and for you to read and help you fall asleep. :)

Buses:

School buses are a means of transportation provided by the state of North Carolina. For the safety of all bus riders, students are expected to:

- Follow the directions of the bus driver at all times.
- Stay in their assigned seat
- Keep hands, feet and objects to self.
- Keep voices low with no “ugly talk” or cursing.
- No eating or drinking on the bus.

Failure to observe these rules may result in a bus ticket. A copy of the ticket will be sent home to be signed and returned the next day. Constant misbehaviors will result in other consequences and could lead to the student’s removal from the bus. Any bus concerns should be dealt with through Mrs. Cagle, Trindale’s bus coordinator.

Finally as an FYI, we will have to have a fire drill during the first week of school. The teachers will work on the procedure the first few days of school, but I wanted you to be aware that we will have a drill.
