What is it?

The National Junior Honor Society is the nation's premier organization established to recognize outstanding middle level students. Five main purposes have guided chapters of NJHS from the beginning: to create enthusiasm for scholarship; to stimulate a desire to render service; to promote leadership; to encourage responsible citizenship; and to develop character in the students of secondary schools.

How do I join?

NJHS at Platteview Central is for our 8th grade students. Students in the 7th grade can begin the application process in February. This application includes providing examples of how students demonstrate the 5 pillars of NJHS (scholarship, leadership, service, citizenship, and character).
