A suggestion was made to start some late blooming plants in the greenhouse, transplant them into the Rye garden and notate the students' project with a sign.

Brenda Eaves suggested that Mark McFarlin's fourth grade class might like to be a part of this project, and offered to speak with him. It was suggested that Wendy Crowley may also be interested in participating.

Rachel Robie was able to procure a donation of ten large buckets from Home Depot/North Hampton to be used for the tomato growing project. She is waiting to hear from Lowe's/Greenland after submitting a letter requesting a donation in kind of buckets from them as well.

Victoria Kilroy suggested asking for a donation of gravel for the bottom of the tomato buckets.

Tracy Griffenhagen and Mark McFarlin have made contact with some teachers in Seabrook who are very interested in coming to NHS to observe the greenhouse/garden and partner with some of the grades. The third grade class from Seabrook will be working with our fourth grade class and Seabrook's fifth grade students will be partnering with Wendy Crowley's class.
