Mark McFarlin expressed an interest in planting a vegetable/ herb mixture this year replacing petunias.

Margaret inquired if there was still interest in planting the Canna lilies- everyone was in agreement that they were a success and should be planted again this year.

Brenda and Rachel have expressed interest in starting a greenhouse club. Joel has offered to help and suggested contacting Jim O'Hara to inquire whether the club could be run through the recreation department.

Rachel suggested creating a flyer to announce the formation of the club and sending it through blackboard connect.

Brenda has offered to draft a flyer with a description of the club.

It was agreed that the club should be limited to 12 students -however all grades are welcome.

The stewards are in agreement that a greenhouse club is a great idea with many possibilities.
