Title 1 Basic Skills Improvement Program and Parent Involvement Policy

The North Wildwood School District is committed to the goal of providing a quality education for every child in the district. The Basic Skills Improvement Program (BSIP) is designed to provide additional support to those students identified as needing educational help in the areas of reading, language arts, and mathematics.

Students are identified through multiple measures such as, classroom performances as observed by the classroom teacher and indicated through student work samples and test scores, both criterion referenced and standardized tests such as the NJASK and NJ PASS and teacher and parent recommendation.

At least once annually, a public meeting shall be held for the purpose of informing parents/guardians of all eligible children about the program and activities provided by Title 1 funds. The agenda may include:

- a. Informing parents/guardians of their right to consult in the design and implementation of the Title 1 project.
- b. Providing parent/guardians with information concerning the Title 1 law, regulations, and instructional program.
- c. Soliciting parents/ guardians' input about the Basic Skills Improvement Programs and related activities.
- d. Providing parents/guardians an opportunity to establish mechanisms for ongoing communication among parents/ guardians, staff and the Board of Education.

According to the new Title 1 regulations, each school must share responsibility with parents for high performance by developing a school-parent-student compact. These compacts highlight how parents, staff, and students share responsibility for promoting high student achievement. Parents will receive the compact from their child's school with a checklist of responsibilities that teachers, parents, and students will have for helping students achieve their goals. Parents are urged to discuss the compact with their children before signing it and having their children sign.

The superintendent of School, in conjunction with the administration, shall evaluate the BSIP program annually and report to the Board of Education as to its effectiveness in achieving and maintaining acceptable levels of student performance.

Dear Parent/Guardian:

The *Elementary and Secondary Education Act* is our country's most important federal education law. In 2001 this law was reauthorized and is now called the *No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB)*. *NCLB* was designed to make changes in teaching and learning that will help increase academic achievement in our schools.

The law requires that all schools receiving Title I funds must inform parents of their right to ask schools about the qualifications of their child's teachers. Our school receives Title I funding and we are happy to share this information with you at your request.

We believe that nothing is more important to your child's education at school than having a well-prepared and highly qualified teacher. The law requires that all teachers who teach in core content areas must meet a specific legal definition of "highly qualified" in order to teach in schools that receive Title I funding. The legal definition of a "highly qualified teacher" has three parts. It states that the teacher must have the following:

- 1. A four-year college degree
- 2. A regular teaching certificate/license
- 3. Proof of his/her knowledge in the subject they teach

New Jersey has some of the most qualified teachers in the country, and we are extremely proud of the quality of the teaching staff in the North Wildwood School District. All our regular teachers have college degrees and many have advanced degrees. The state of New Jersey has always required a teaching certificate/license for all teachers. In addition, every teacher continues learning through professional development activities and our teachers are evaluated each year to make sure that their teaching skills remain at the highest possible level. Most teachers already meet this legal definition of highly qualified. Teachers in the state of New Jersey are required to meet this definition.

To ensure that every child in every classroom has a highly qualified teacher, the state of New Jersey and our school district are working together to help teachers meet the requirements of the federal law by providing several options. Teachers may take a content Praxis test, or they can demonstrate their expertise through a college major in the content.

A highly qualified teacher knows what to teach, how to teach, and has a full understanding of the subject matter being taught. We believe that every teacher in our school is fully qualified and dedicated to teaching your child, and we will do everything possible to help our teachers who may not yet meet the legal definition required by the federal government.

I encourage you to support your child's education and communicate with your child's teacher(s) on a regular basis.
