Principal's Highlights

The school is focusing on school-wide learning based on student needs, centering our attention on language instruction and the rigor/relevance of the curriculum.

- The school has implemented a school-wide writing curriculum called Write Steps writing.
- The staff and parents have developed a culture of collaboration around the common vision, mission, values, and goals.
- The school has implemented Professional Development Wednesday with staff members taking an active part in the development of schedules and topics.
- Each classroom is equipped with a Audio Enhancement audio system, an interactive Smartboard and student computers.

- Students set a new 30 day school record in Renaissance with over 12.5 million words read.

- Our after-school tutoring program helps struggling students in reading and math.

Goals and Objectives

Goal 1

JG Johnson students will improve in reading comprehension skills based on standardized state-wide proficiency assessment.

Objective(s):

Students in grades 3-5 will increase reading comprehension scores from 34% to 55% (measured by the CRTs) by implementing smarter-balanced DOK (Depth of Knowledge) questions across all grade levels.

Goal 2

JG Johnson Elementary will increase their writing proficiency on the Formative Writing Assessment.

Objective(s):

At JG Johnson Elementary School, the percent of proficient students in grades 3-5 will increase to 35%. Students will demonstrate sufficient or deep command of writing as measured by the Nevada Formative Writing Rubric through implementing Write Steps Writing across all grade levels.
