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Games Help with Math Understanding?

Has your student come home and told you about a new game they learned in math? Games are an integral part of the Everyday Mathematics program. These games allow the students to practice and master math skills and also do some critical thinking. One of the games introduced is called "Top-It" and is played at all the grade levels various math skills using (number recognition all the way to multiplication). Ask your child if they have learned and played this game.

es. In science we have been studying plants and animals, the seasonal changes, and animal migrations. In social studies we're working on what it is to be good citizens. Our reading class has read all kinds of stories from going into space and walking in the desert to a story about how two dogs rescue their master. As you can see we are learning about lots of things. Learning doesn't stop in the classroom. Learning continues long after the bell stops.

One of the questions I get from students is why do I need to learn some of this stuff. They act like the only place they'll ever use what's learned is only in the classroom. I can talk about where you use what's learned, but kids need to see and experience life applications of what's learned at school. That's where parents can be the most help.

As parents you can show real life applications every day. If you go to the convenience store have your child figure the change from buying a small item. When you do baking have your children help. They'll learn fractions and customary units of measure. Have your child cook a microwave dinner. They have to read the directions, and if the meal doesn't turn out they'll learn the importance of reading directions. When you go to Red Rock, Ash Meadows, etc. they'll get extensions in science. If you see a historical marker by the road, stop and read it. You'd be surprised at what you'll find out. Here's a new one. Watch the TV with closed caption on and the volume turned down. Your kids will practice reading and start hearing voice in their reading. As you can see we can enhance what happens in the classroom at little or no cost. The benefits will add meaning to the lives of our students.
