



THS maintains an open door policy. Parents and members of the community are encouraged to visit anytime. Student passwords give parents and students on-line access through Power School, to student grades, e-mail contact with teachers, and other pertinent information regarding student progress. Parents can further access information through the school website. Computers are available for parent and student use in school and community libraries. School information is regularly published in the community and school newspapers. Open house is held in the fall; and parent conferences are held in the fall and spring. Progress reports are mailed home every three weeks. Tonopah is a small, close-knit community. The high school is a center for social activity which provides frequent opportunity for contact between parents, students, administration, and staff members. Information regarding events being held at the high school is posted on a town marquee, as well as in the newspaper, and on the website.
