COMMUNITY: The Lawrence School District is a diverse residential community located in the southwest quadrant of Long Island, approximately twenty miles from mid-town Manhattan and easily accessible by public and private transportation. The District encompasses one high school, one middle school, two elementary schools, and an early childhood/kindergarten center. We are a culturally, economically, and ethnically diverse school district. Recently, there has been an increase in the percentage of minority and working-class populations in our district, which has coincided with an expanded private school District continues to be renowned for the excellence of its course and program offerings and achievements of its students and staff. SCHOOL AND CURRICULUM: Lawrence High School is a 4-year secondary school accredited by the New York State Board of Regents. The High School provides for the needs of all students through a variety of Regents, Honors, and AP courses. In addition, college level courses allow students to earn college credit and are offered in conjunction with Long Island University–C.W. Post, Adelphi University, New York Institute of Technology, Syracuse University, and Molloy College. A Special Projects Program in science and social studies prepares students for the Intel Science Talent Search as well as other competitions.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAMS: Lawrence High School offers 17 Advanced Placement (AP) courses. These courses follow the College Board curriculum and all students are required to take the AP examination. The AP courses offered are: Art, Art History, English, Calculus A/B, Calculus A/B, Biology, Physics, Statistics, Psychology, French, Spanish, American History, European History, Economics, Government, and Chemistry, Environmental Science.
