



## **The NYPD With Arms Wide Open Detective Steven McDonald Memorial Scholarship**

### **SCHOLARSHIP MISSION STATEMENT AND REQUIREMENTS**

The mission of NYPD With Arms Wide Open is to provide a forum where police officers of all ranks, and their families, can attend meetings and discuss issues surrounding being the parents/guardians/care-takers of a child with special needs. Often times, families with special needs children feel isolated and are in need of an organization that addresses their very specific needs and issues. NYPD With Arms Wide Open helps these families care for their children while navigating through the culture, complexities and dangers of being a member of the New York City Police Department.

As an officer with the NYPD, Steven McDonald was questioning three young men in Central Park one summer day in 1986 when one of them shot him three times – leaving him paralyzed from the neck down, and dependent on a breathing apparatus. After a long recovery and rehabilitation, Detective McDonald spoke to thousands of students in schools up and down the East Coast. Aside from re-counting the harrowing events of the day that changed his life, McDonald focused on his remarkable journey and the power of perseverance and forgiveness.

In the spirit of all that Detective Steven McDonald stood for, NYPD With Arms Wide Open has established a scholarship award for students within the NYPD community living with special needs or those who are the family members of an individual with special needs,

**Applicant must have a family member within the NYPD** and be a graduating high school senior, with good academic and disciplinary standing who meet one or more of the following criteria:

- 1.) Is a student of the special needs community\*
- 2.) Is the sibling of an individual with special needs\*

*\* Special needs must be a documented physical, developmental or learning disability.*

Please return this form (all pages completed), as well as the following documents:

1. A signed letter of recommendation from a teacher, therapist, coach, member of the clergy, or any non-family member. Please ask them to highlight your contributions to the special needs community.
2. Your personal essay with each page *marked with your date of birth only*. Please remove your name and any other identifying information. This ensures a completely transparent voting process for the scholarship committee.
3. A brief personal bio (one page) and high resolution (.jpeg preferred) headshot or Senior Portrait to be published in the Dinner Dance Journal should applicant be awarded scholarship
4. A copy of your college or vocational school acceptance letter, or a list of the top 3-5 schools you have applied to.

Submissions will be accepted up to and including Thursday, March 1, 2018. E-mail confirmation will be sent once completed entry is received. - Do you think everyone, regardless of disability has the ability to lead by example? Explain.
- What motivates you to spend your time in community service with children/ individuals with special needs? What did you give up in order to pursue your service?
- What would a peer in a group you lead and/or perform service with say about you and your service to special needs individuals?

**CLOSING STATEMENT** - How has the life story of Detective Steven McDonald inspired you as an individual with special needs, or the family member or friend of an individual with special needs? What message, like Detective McDonald's message of peace and forgiveness, would you speak about to others if given the platform?
