The Juggalos

Scary clowns have never been the talking matter of average people in school... or pretty much anywhere. However, after the large uprising of a "crazy clown gang" known as the Juggalos over the last few weeks (though they've existed for years), it has become the subject matter of many news channels around the U.S. So, what's their purpose? Well, it's hard to say. The Juggalos originated from fans of a 1990's band known as the "Insane Clown Posse." They stand for many things, not necessarily for protest (until recently) but just for belief. According to the official group and website, they've gathered to share and celebrate music, love, fellowship and comradery. The Juggalos are generally characterized by their painted faces which resemble clowns, their music style (usually horrorcore, underground rap), their references to violence in their logos, and their callouts to each other (sounds like, "whoop, whoop"). For what seems to be an organization with peaceful beliefs, it's hard to believe that anything could be peaceful, given their persona. To prove that they do believe in what they say, the Juggalos have held multiple charity fundraisers, and took part in large gatherings for community service. Despite this, in recent years the Juggalos have been associated with gang violence due to vio-

lent members and violent outsiders dressed similarly, committing violent crimes. As a result of the few who have committed criminal offenses (robbery, drug trafficking, burglaries and shootings), the organization as a whole has been given a bad reputation. The FBI reported the Juggalos as a hybrid gang, which is what led to their protest; the march on Washington which took place on September 16th, 2017. United, they stood and protested for the FBI to remove the Juggalos from the official list of gangs in the United States. To them, this act was a success, despite their inability to officially remove their name from the list; they believed that regardless of the outcome, they had united for a cause which they would continue to fight for. It's unclear whether the group truly deserves to be removed from the list because it is hard to tell just how many members are actually violent. Thus, no FBI action has been taken yet in combat to their cause. Nonetheless, through the march they have shown unity. 
Improvements in Lawrence


This new school year, we gained


