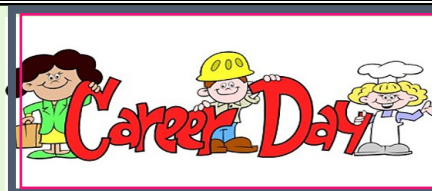


The second graders spent the afternoon engaged in hands on learning activities about water, how to use it, how to save it and how to share it.
