Message from the Principal:

Dear Parents,

When looking at our high school's report card, please remember that this covers the 2015-2016 school year, not the one we just completed.

On our report card, the Biology I End-Of-Instruction test was very close to the state average. Algebra I and US History fell slightly below state averages, while English II rose above the state average. Algebra II, Geometry, and English III did not have to take an End-Of-Instruction exam due to their passing alternative assessments prior to the testing window. We have made an effort this year to improve our tests scores in all subject areas. We have attempted to help students pass these EOI tests by having remediation time built into our school day. Students below average or failing these classes have mandatory tutorial each week until the grade or grades are average or better. This means that students who are struggling have 20 minutes per day to meet with their highly qualified teachers in small group settings to seek help. We feel this has and will greatly benefit our students.

In addition to the End-Of-Instruction tests, our school had a 100% graduation rate with a 0% dropout rate, both of which are better than the state averages of 98.3% and 7.2% respectively. The average GPA of our graduates was a 3.5 and their average ACT score was a 22. Both of these are also better than the state average.

Our goal is to give all students the opportunity to obtain a great education at Kremlin-Hillsdale Public Schools. Never hesitate to call with any concerns about your child's education.

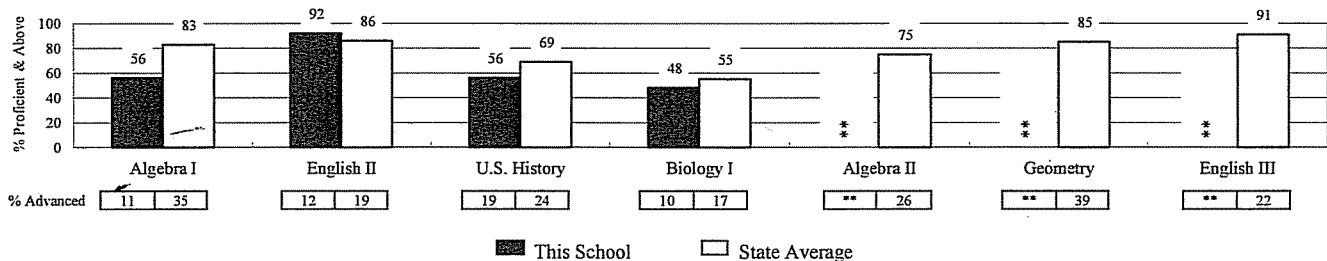

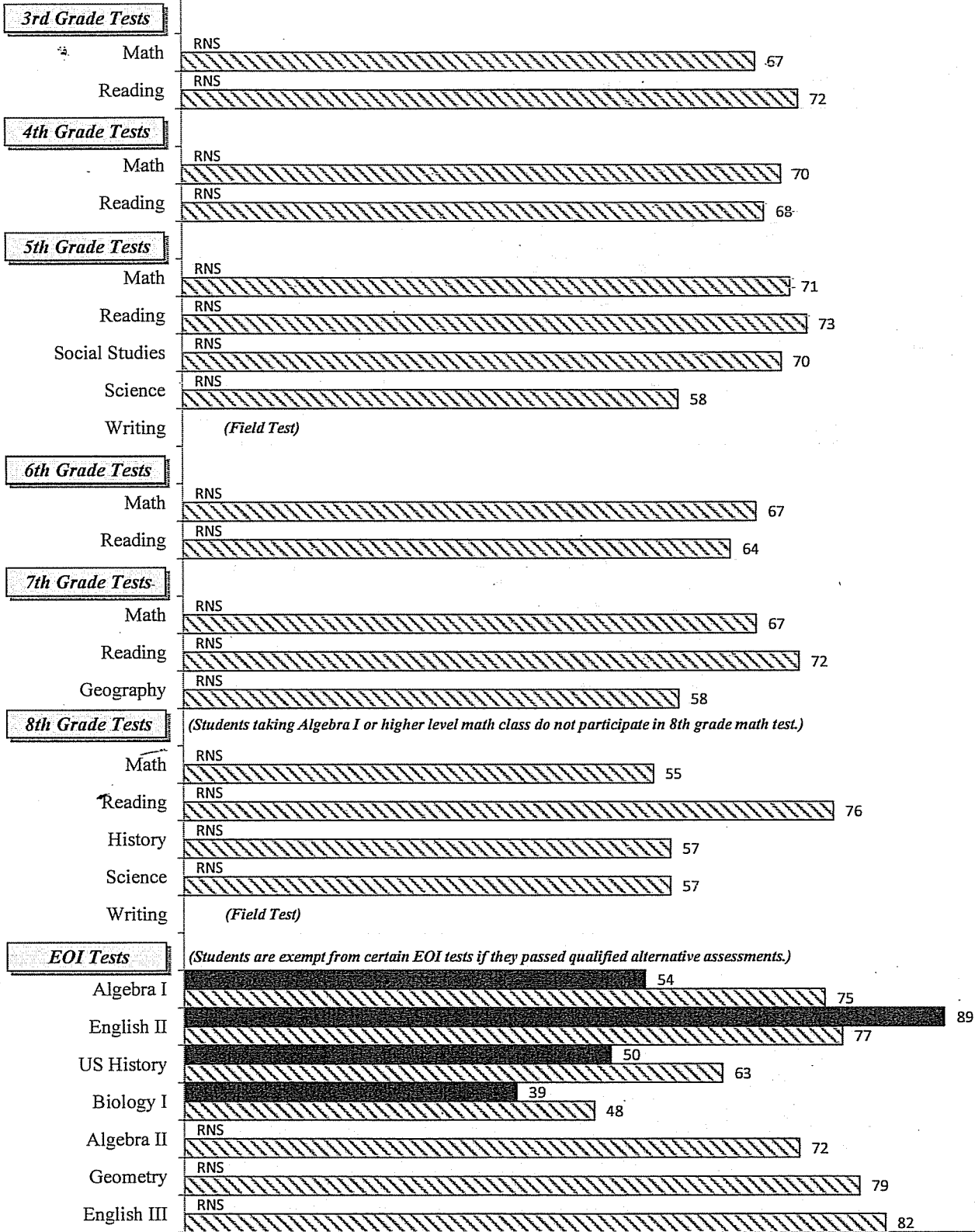

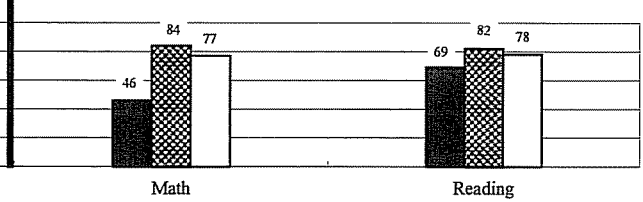

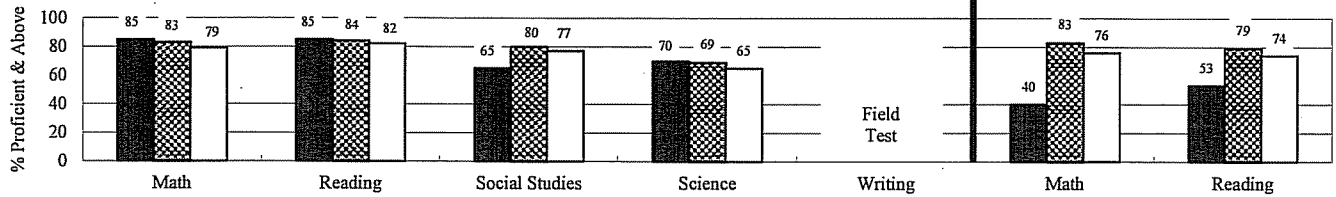
3rd Grade Tests*



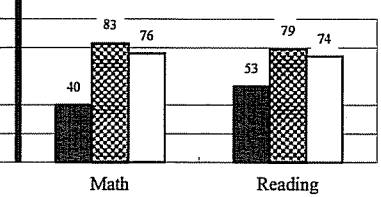
4th Grade Tests*



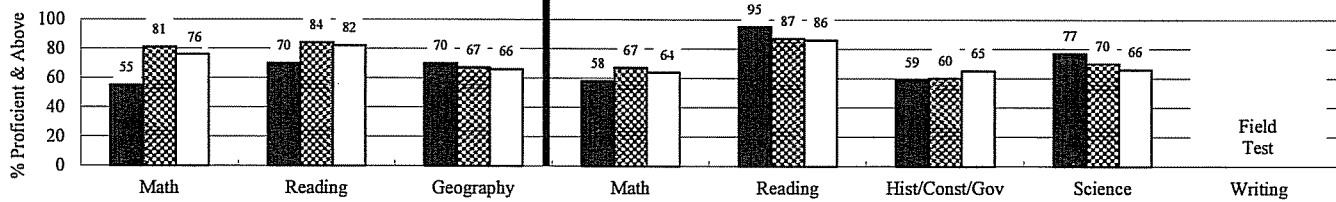
5th Grade Tests*

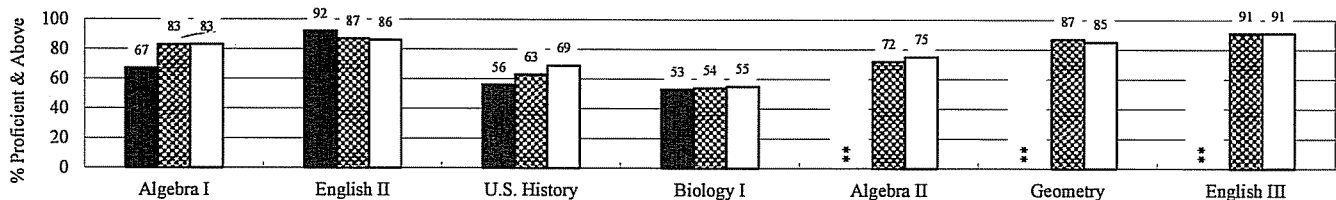
