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

Ways to Support Numbers and Operations · Help your student to look for and explain real life "word problems" that contain positive and negative decimals and fractions (for example, if I save 1/4 of my total earnings each month, how much will I save after one year?). Algebraic Reasoning and Algebra · Help your student make connections in order to solve real world and mathematical problems involving proportions (such as finding the "better deal" at the grocery store comparing multiple sizes of the same product and explaining how they know it is the better deal). Geometry and Measurement Focus on proportional reasoning and how it relates to geometric shapes. (For example, compare the sizes of three-dimensional boxes. Which one holds more? Which one would take the most paper to wrap? How do they know? Compare different sizes of circles. Which circle's area is the largest/smallest? How do they know?) Data and Probability Collect and analyze data, including making predictions using measures of central tendency and probability by having your student look at different real-world graphs and find the average, median, mode, and range of the number data. Ask them questions about the data. (For example, what does this data tell your student? What does it make your student wonder?) • To make predictions using probability, play a board game or a card game together. Ask about the

probabilities involved and what predictions could be made using those probabilities (such as

landing on a certain square or rolling a certain number).

Using this Report to Meet with Your Student's Teacher or School

As your student's first teacher, you are a critical part of their education. It is important to remember that your student's strengths, abilities and potential cannot be measured by a single test score. Each student grows at different rates both physically and academically. State tests help gauge how your student is growing in the knowledge and skills outlined in the Oklahoma Academic Standards. State test results, when combined with other information (i.e. report card grades, teacher feedback, classroom performance and local tests) can help you and the teacher understand where your student is making progress and where they may need extra support. Ask your student's teachers and/or school:

- Where do you think my student is excelling? What can I do to support their success?
- What do you think is giving my student the most trouble? How can I help my student improve in this area?
- What can I do to help my student with upcoming work?
- What learning experiences and opportunities do you provide to support my student's growth?
