Ten of these students are in the academic bowl class; over half are in band; six are on the football team, etc. One of the advantages of being at KHS is the opportunity that students have to participate in many different activities. And most if trying out have played on teams in high school and/or junior high. It is fun to watch the excitement as these kids compete for spots on the varsity team.

There is a FroshMore Tournament (for freshmen and sophomore teams) along with a junior high tournament on December 10. A varsity team of six students will be named in November. District, Regional, Area and State tournaments, along with invitational at OSU, Edmond Memorial, NOC-Tonkawa, and the Cherokee Strip Conference tournament will keep them busy.

KHS competed in a tournament at OSU on Saturday, September 24, and defeated Stillwater, Ponca City, Kingfisher, and Tahlequah A; lost to Drummond and Edmond Memorial for fifth seed in the tournament part. KHS defeated Ponca City again, but lost again to Drummond. Mandy Schroeder was high scorer for the whole tournament! Broncs start off 5-3 against top grade completion!

OK Junior Academic Bowl Association (OJABA) competition will begin later this fall. KHS will again field four teams: 5th/6th; 6th/7th; 7th/8th; and 8th/9th. Three teams qualified for state last year and hopefully all four will this year.
