Scholarship Requirements

The Greater St. Luke Development Council prides itself on serving the needs of the citizens in the communities of St. Luke, Brown's Ferry (Dunbar, Oatland and Lanes Creek), Knox Swamp, and Carver's Bay. We are proud to award our first scholarship to a deserving senior of the 2018 graduating class. Our first scholarship will be funded by our fundraiser that will be held in the spring and/or as determined by the members. The amount of the award for the Scholarship is based on the actual income from the event, which could range from \$500 - \$1000.

Guidance Counselors are asked to assist the students and follow the instructions carefully on the Scholarship Checklist and Application form, and review the criteria for the scholarship to verify that the applicants meet the criteria.

To be awarded this scholarship, the high school senior must be accepted for enrollment in an accredited two or four year college/university or technical school. Additionally, the candidate has to be an African American male or female and reside in one of the following communities: St. Luke, Brown's Ferry – Dunbar, Oatland, and Lanes Creek, Knox Swamp, or Carver's Bay.

The applications must be received no later than April 15, 2018.

Please follow instructions carefully.

All applicants must be citizens of the US and must attend, or plan to attend an accredited college, university or technical school in the US.

Only applications completed correctly and submitted in one package will be considered. Incorrect applications are discarded and no records are returned.

Only the recipient(s) of the scholarship(s) will be notified by the Scholarship Chair following the approval of a ruling by the Scholarship Committee.

The award will be placed on deposit with the college or university and any unused portion shall be returned to Greater St. Luke Development Council. The award is based on academic excellence, letters of reference, essays and other noted criteria. All scholarship applications must be received by April 15th to the address listed.

Scholarship Requirements:

1. Pursue an accredited 2 or 4 year program in preparation for a degree or certification for career
2. Attain a Grade Point Average of 2.75 or higher
3. Perform a minimum of 20 hours of Volunteer Service/Community Service
4. Provide SAT/ACT scores
5. Provide a transcript
